NO Exhibitor Entry Forms or additions to Exhibitor Entry Forms will be accepted after the deadline date of Tuesday, September 12, 2023 at midnight.

EXHIBIT DROP OFF DATES & TIMES: NON-LIVESTOCK AND LIVESTOCK entries will be accepted at the Fair Grounds on Friday, September 15th ONLY from 1pm to 7pm. 4-H DOG entries are permitted on the Fair Grounds on the morning of Sunday, September 17, 2023, and only in designated area. See 4-H Dog show for further information.

NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE. NO EARLY OR LATE ARRIVALS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

- Pre-printed Exhibit Tags (excluding Livestock & 4-H Dog) will be ready for pick up when you bring in your exhibits on Friday, September 15th between 1:00 and 7:00 pm
- Agriculture and Pavilion Exhibits will be judged Friday, September 15th at 7:30 pm. Judging is closed to the public.
- Each Exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class, excluding livestock classes.
- No live insects may be entered.
- Any exhibit entered in the wrong category will be disqualified.
- There are NO ENTRY FEES for exhibits except for Beef 3 Year Challenge (B01-A) and Beef and Sheep Carcass (B18 & U18).
- Please see the Exhibit Class Lists for specific rules for each category (Beef, Sheep, Home Canning, Home Cooking, Art, Plants & Flowers etc.)
- The decision of the judges shall be final. There will be NO TIED PLACINGS. Where there is just one entry in a class, the judge will use discretion in awarding either a first, second or third, or no prize at all, depending on the quality of the exhibit. The judge has the right to disqualify for any reason. If an entry is disqualified the reasoning will be noted on the back of the tag.
- Prize money will be mailed to the address on the Exhibitor Form. Cheques will not be issued if the Exhibitor's aggregate total prize money is \$5.00 or less, and will be considered a donation (with appreciation) to the Fair. If cheques are not cashed within six months of cheque date they become stale-dated and will be considered a donation to the Fair. New cheques will not be issued in these circumstances. Cheques that are lost within 6 months from issue date can be re-issued, however, the fee for stop payment of lost cheque will be deducted from prize amount owing.
- Only one prize exhibit in any one class, either in the Pavilion or Agriculture Building is given credit toward the Grand Aggregate Trophy or the Reserve Grand Aggregate Trophy.
- Aggregate point values are as follows: 1st place 5 points, 2nd place 3 points, 3rd place 1 point
- In the event of a tie in an aggregate calculation, the person with the most 1st places will
 win. If there is still a tie, determination will be made by amount of 2nd and/or 3rd place
 results.
- Trophies will not be taken home. Name and year will be engraved by the RCBFA.
- Exhibits registered and exhibited in classes at the Fair must remain in class for the duration of Fair. Exhibits must not be pulled or sold.
- Night watchman will be on duty starting Friday, and while every precaution will be taken
 to avoid accidents or damage, the Rock Creek & Boundary Fair Association will not
 accept responsibility in the event of loss or damage to any exhibit or injury to any
 contestants or spectators.

- Sheep must be free of parasites and disease. All animals subject to health inspection. Health inspection will take place on Friday, September 15, 2023, between 6pm and 7pm (failure to comply will result in disqualification of entire flock and the animals must be removed from the Fair Grounds)
- Any lambs born after January 1, 2019, must have tails docked between the 2nd and 3rd knuckle. If docked too short, owner will be asked to remove sheep from Fair Grounds.

 EXCEPTIONS. ANIMALS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO UNLOAD IF ANIMAL
 DOES NOT BEAR AN APPROVED TAG. ALL EXHIBITORS SHOULD HAVE SPARE
 TAGS AVAILABLE. IF AN ANIMAL LOSES A TAG WHILE ON FAIRGROUNDS
 PROPERTY, THE EXHIBITOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING AND
 ATTACHING THE REPLACEMENT TAG WITHIN TWO HOURS OF NOTIFICATION
 OF THE MISSING TAG OR THE ANIMAL WILL BE REQUIRED TO BE REMOVED
 FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS.
- ENTRY DEADLINE All animals in both Open & 4-H classes must be registered with the FAIR OFFICE by September 12, 2023, including class and tag number of each animal. All 4-H Member projects must be pre-registered by leaders, must have name, project and tag number to FAIR OFFICE by September 12, 2023. - <u>Cattle entries will be accepted on Friday September 15, 2023 between 1:00</u> pm and 7:00 pm. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Livestock must be free of parasites and disease. All animals subject to health inspection. Health inspection will take place on Friday, September 15, 2023, between 6:00 and 7:00 PM. Failure to comply will result in disqualification and animal must be removed from the Fair Grounds.
- Only one entry per Family Farm in the Carcass Class. Only 8 spaces available for this class. Call Dean to reserve yours! 250-446-2420.
- Children under the age of seven (7) years old are not permitted in the show ring. Children who are seven (7) years of age may show calves only (with no parental assistance). Children who are eight (8) years of age and older are permitted to show full size cattle. Waivers must be signed by parent or legal guardian for exhibitors between the ages of seven (7) and eighteen (18) who are not 4-H club members.
- Night ties are required for ALL BEEF.
- Nose rings are MANDATORY for bulls.
- Name signs must be posted for all animals and include owner's name, breed, weight and tag #.
- ALL CLASSES (Except Carcass Class): If more than 9 entries, will be divided into two classes and will enter the ring by animal's age, youngest to oldest.
- All Exhibitors must pay gate entrance fee.
- All Exhibitors, who are camping on Rock Creek & Boundary Fair Grounds property, must camp in designated areas and pay camping fees.

A one-time entry fee of \$25/head will be divided 50%, 30%, 20% among their year winners. If only one or two complete the three years, they divide the purse.
